### ELABORATING THE POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS

- Presentation by **Riccardo Alcaro/Nathalie Tocci**, Istituto Affari Internazionali, Rome
  - Drafting the policy recommendations in light of WPs2-8 and Delphi findings
  - In cases where divergence prevails, recommendations should
    - indicate how to avoid further divisions
    - indicate how to build transatlantic bridges
  - In case where convergence prevails, recommendations should
    - distinguish between issue-areas according to the order of priority US and EU give them
    - on issue-areas to which a similar order of priority is given in US and EU, indicate common/coordinated policies in the short/mid/long-term
    - on issue-areas to which a different order of priority is given in US and EU, indicate how US and EU/European countries can attain an acceptable division of labour in the short/mid/long-term
  - In both cases, recommendations should indicate how US and EU can boost global governance structures
